- very engaged, knows what he is talking about, is trying to make the theories in the paper as comprehensible as possible

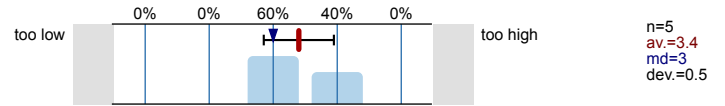

Comments regarding **positive aspects** of this course (optional):

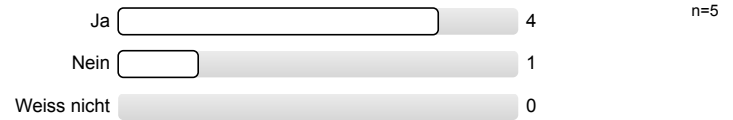
- all papers were interesting, some drier than others but all of them made me learn something new, or have a new perspective of things.

Please elaborate on aspects in **need of improvement** (e. g., ideas on the course content, learning objectives):

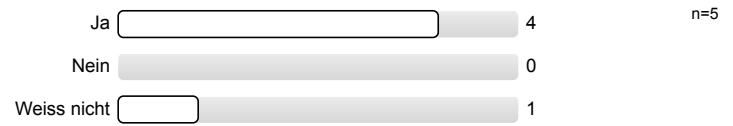
